Hundreds of professional artists, dance companies, youth organizations, and dance/drum enthusiasts come from the United States, Europe, Canada, the Caribbean, and Africa to partake in three days of dancing and drumming instruction from the best trainers available. This year's **concert** production, *The Spirit Lives On*, will celebrate KanKouran's 35 years of outstanding educational and cultural programming for local, national and international audiences, and fulfilling its mission to preserve and promote traditional West African culture by providing quality entertainment and educational programs to local and national audiences in an effort to facilitate cross-cultural enrichment. Through his meticulous and careful choreography, Assane Konte, KanKouran's Co-founder and Artistic Director, will present a splendid array of celebratory dances that will feature KanKouran's Senior, Junior and Children's Companies and the Adult Community Dance Class.
